

SPIRITUAL CONFESSION AND SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

One of the best acts of piety and devotion is the practice of SPIRITUAL CONFESSION and SPIRITUAL COMMUNION. No Catholic should go to bed at night without making both of these acts.

A SPIRITUAL CONFESSION and a SPIRITUAL COMMUNION is simply a "play like" confession and communion. Remember when you were little children you liked to "play house". One of you was the "Mamma" the other was the "Daddy" and you might have even found someone besides a doll to be the "little baby" Even though you are now grown up you can still draw great profit by living in a child's world of "make believe".

And so, each night before you retire you PRETEND that you are going to Confession and to Communion. You simply carry out the following easy steps.

- You kneel at your bedside and dream. YOU DREAM THAT YOU ARE IN CHURCH WAIT-ING TO GO TO CONFESSION.
- 2. YOU EXAMINE YOUR CONSCIENCE. You ask yourself the following questions:
 - a. How did I fail today?
 - b. What could I have done to have made this day better?
 - c. Did I commit any mortal sin today?
 - d. Any venial sin?
 - e. Did I give in to any deliberate faults pride? anger? unkindness? impatience? boasting? hurt others feelings? neglected prayer? etc.
 - f. What good did I do today? What virtues did I practice?
- 3. Then pretend you are kneeling in the Confessional. Christ is sitting on the other side of the screen. YOU TELL YOUR FAULTS AND SINS TO CHRIST AND ASK HIS FORGIVE-NESS. You tell Him you are very sorry and promise that you will avoid them in the future. After this YOU THANK HIM for the grace He gave you to accomplish whatever good deeds you performed that day.
- 4. NOW MAKE AN ACT OF PERFECT CONTRITION. The best way to do this is to look at the crucifix. Meditate on Christ's suffering and tell Him you are sorry that you committed these faults and sins because you know that they have hurt Him, Who has loved you so

much. Christ now lifts His Hand, makes the Sign of the Cross over you and says the words of absolution.

- 5. Then (you are still dreaming) you walk up the aisle of the Church and kneel at the Communion rail. While kneeling there you tell Christ how anxious you are to receive Him within yourself. YOU PRETEND THAT YOU ARE ACTUALLY RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION.
- You leave the Communion rail and return to your pew. Now SPEND SEVERAL MINUTES SIMPLY TALK-ING TO CHRIST WITHIN YOU.

That is all there is to it!

But what a wonderful help to our spiritual life! Of course, if you have mortal sin on your soul you still have to go to Confession. However, it is possible that some of your venial sins will be forgiven by the intensity of your acts of sorrow and love made in the course of this Spiritual Confession and Spiritual Communion.

Spiritual Confession and Spiritual Communion are NOT a substitute for the real reception of these Sacraments, but they do help us to receive the Sacraments of Confession and Communion more worthily.

EVERY DAY OF HIS RELIGIOUS LIFE FATHER SEELOS MADE A SPIRITUAL CONFESSION AND SPIRITUAL COMMUNION. We urge you to imitate him.

If every night before you go to bed you follow the six simple steps listed above you will without doubt sanctify your soul.
