In January we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family. Therefore we thought it would be appropriate to consider Father Seelos' love for his own family. Any one who read the many letters he wrote to them saw this love shine forth on every page.

However strong this attachment was, his love for God shone forth even more. He had applied for admission to the Redemptorists before he left to study at the University of Munich. He felt sure his letter of acceptance would arrive shortly but he never mentioned his plans even though he knew that this would be his last vacation with his family. He did speak to his father in a more or less general way trying to find out what his father's feelings were. He heartily agreed with his son that he should go to the foreign missions if he so desired. Nothing was said to the rest of the family about it. When his vacation came to an end, he very affectionately said goodbye to them, knowing he would never see them again.

After receiving a letter of admission from the superior of the Redemptorists in America, he did not visit his family, but rather wrote each one of them a farewell letter.

When he was travelling to the port city of LeHavre, he passed near his home town of Fussen. He felt he would only deepen his family's pain of separation if he visited them again. He, therefore, sacrificed a final farewell visit offering to God the sorrow it cost him.

He died without ever returning to his native land to see his loved ones.

Many of us could very well imitate Father Seelos' love for his family. Too often we realize when it is too late how generously God has endowed us with good parents, brothers, sisters. No doubt his brothers and sisters had their little scraps as all children do. After all, they were human like all of us. But as they grew to manhood and womanhood they were very close to each other.

Thank God for your family, whether small or large, and strive in every way to be helpful to them.

"On September 28 of this year our second son was born to us, David Paul Seelos C. . . . . There were four other children between our first and David, who didn't live. One was born alive, one died in childbirth and two were lost before birth. The doctors say they were lost because of an RH blood incompatibility between my wife and me.

"We wanted other children desperately and so we placed our cause in the hands of Father Seelos. There were many people praying with us this time and by the mercy of Almighty God and the intercession of Father Seelos, a son was born to us.

"Now, the doctors in Rome may not see this as a miracle in the strict sense, but to us who have had so many disappointments, it most surely means that God in His own divine way "interfered" with nature. David had heart failure shortly after he was born and the pediatrician commented that it "is a miracle" he is still alive. My wife, for the second or third time, gave birth to a child with a circumvallate placenta (an occurrence which we are told happens once in a thousand cases.) The obstetrician also commented that "it was a miracle" she was able to carry this baby for the whole nine months.

"I realize that both doctors were speaking in the idiom of our language and not in the technical

sense which Rome applies to the word miracle. However, we see it as a miracle of God's mercy, a demonstration of His power through the intercession of one of His great saints and a gift of His infinite love.

"Our eternal thanks to Father Seelos. Please let us help make him a saint. We will pray."

"A year ago my son became ill and was paralyzied and the doctors did not think he would live. He was hospitalized for a year and we were told he would not walk. But today he is home and walking, thanks to Father Seelos. He has some stiffness in his hips and his legs are not straight yet, but I pray every day to Father Seelos to help him walk a little better.

"Please pray with me that his legs will become straight, and the stiffness will leave his hips."

"I recently obtained a favor through the intercession of Father Seelos. My little daughter was tested for tuberculosis and the test proved positive. The doctor advised us to have a chest X-ray. I prayed very hard to Father Seelos and when I finally received a report from the doctor he told me the X-ray was negative.

"I am grateful to Father Seelos for his intercession on behalf of my little girl."

"Rev. Francis Seelos has been kind to me. Through his intercession I have been cured of a bronchial cold which was long and painful.
