The Seelos family lived in happiness in their big three story house. "Big" in this case does not mean riches. There were ten children in the family, including the adopted son John, whom they called "the little prince" among themselves. On the third floor of the house in Fuessen was the attic-barn where the fresh-smelling hay was stacked. It was from this floor that young Cunnegunde fell to her death.

Francis Xavier and one of his brothers shared a second floor bedroom. Every night after family prayers, down the long dark hall they would go. Like all small boys they imagined all sorts of things waiting in the darkness. Holding hands they went, each praying to his guardian angel, each afraid to tell the other of his secret fears. Years later, in a poem to his Guardian Angel, Father Seelos remembered these days:

"That interior fear, both of us knew it.

Not because we thought that we would

lose our way.

We walked quiet as mice, Holding
hands to guide each other

Until we reached our goal. "

The same brother complained loudly because Xavier said his rosary every night in bed. Xavier's continued whisperings of "Hail Marys" kept him awake! Young Xavier learned to say his rosary so quietly that his brother was never disturbed again. This nightly habit he kept until his death.

Xavier was his mother's special favorite. He was never as strong as the others and was one of the youngest. Besides this he loved to join her in her personal daily prayers. From this came his great dedication to the Blessed Virgin and the rosary. From the piety and good humor of his parents came the devotion and gaiety of their children.



He was very gay.
Once he masqueraded around the neighborhood streets in his father's wedding suit and high hat!
Good clean fun! Papa Mang took a dim view of the same situation. The good clean fun was brought to a sudden halt by a firm parental blow on the young man's posterior!

He always remembered the punishment; but nothing seemed to down his good spirits.

He enjoyed the games of his friends with zest.

However, his greatest happiness was in pleasing God. The few small pennies he received from his parents were used to decorate an altar he built in the corner of his bedroom. Like his father, he revered the Church at Fuessen and loved to spend as much of his time in it as he could

Although most children were not allowed to receive their First Communion until 12 or 13 years of age, the local priest permitted Xavier to receive his Communion at eleven. From that first moment of boyish joy, the flame of his love for Jesus was never to die in his soul. Immediately he began his first steps toward the altar.

God grant that he will be made a canonized saint during your lifetime, Father Vaughn, as you have worked so hard and faithfully to bring this about and I am sure it would make you and thousands of others so very happy. God bless you always.

"P.S. I forgot to mention that my old brother is seriously ill and does not appear to have much longer to live. He has turned against his Catholic faith, although he was sent to a Catholic School and has a practical Catholic wife and children. I pray daily to Father Seelos for him to come to his senses before it is too late."

For your own intentions, the ones mentioned above and all those placed before the tomb of Father Seelos let us say the following prayer-


