"THE THREE SAINTS OF ST. PHILOMENA'S"

When Father Seelos arrived in Pittsburgh in late 1845, he made the third man in the Redemptorist community. He was soon thrown into the work of caring for souls, baptizing, witnessing marriages, hearing confessions, and preaching in three languages.

His religious superior and pastor was the renowned Father John Neumann. Neumann, like Seelos, had come from middle Europe, specifically Bohemia. He was ordained a priest for the diocese of New York and did pioneer mission work in the northwest part of the state. He became a Redemptorist, and after leaving Pittsburgh served for a time as the vice-provincial superior of the Redemptorists in America. Later on he was made bishop of Philadelphia. He died suddenly in that office. He was declared blessed by Pope Paul VI in 1963.

The other member of the community was Father Joseph Miller. He was best described as short of stature and barrel-chested, a Bavarian who was known to "have a way with him." He was doing most of the mission work, and soon Father Seelos was joining him.

Besides St. Philomena's in the city, these three priests also traveled to outlying German settlements in Sharpeston, McKessport, Riceville, Pine Creek, Greensburg. Calls for help came from as far away as Steubenville, Ohio, and Wheeling, West Virginia.

No wonder the bishop of Pittsburgh, Michael O'Connor, called that Redemptorist community, ''the three saints of St. Philomena's!''

THE VIRTUE FOR JANUARY: FAITH

Patrons: St. Peter and St. Paul Text: I am the light of the world (John 8/12)

Father Seelos was a man of extraordinary Faith, hence he could give advice and instructions on this Virtue. He was asked by one of his followers for an easy method of practicing the Virtue of Faith. The holy priest replied: Just make acts of Faith of what you believe and then put into practice what you believe. Say the simple act of Faith: O my God, I firmly believe these and all the truths the Catholic Church teaches because Thou has revealed them to her. The Church teaches that Jesus Christ is really, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. Because you believe this, you make visits to the Blessed Sacrament, you go to daily Mass and Holy Communion. The Church teaches that the Holy Father is the Vicar of Christ on earth, the successor of St. Peter as Head of the Church and is infallible when he teaches in matters of Faith and Morals. Because you believe this, you are loyal to our Holy Father and never criticize or condemn him. Father Seelos said he could go on for hours talking about the teachings of the Church.

Faith given meaning to our way of living. We must see Christ in our every detail of life. We try to act as Christ acted. We must have a favorite ejaculatory prayer always in our heart and ever on our lips, awaiting all the exigencies of the day, of the hour. A wonderful little prayer is: My God | love you. You are insulted, imposed upon, have to live with certain characters, work with them, be associated with them. They annoy you, antagonize you, frustrate you. You do not become depressed ever. You say, "My God | love You." You remain calm and cheerful as Christ would be.

Your home life is hard, your health is poor, your work is difficult, you meet with trying people, you do not bog down under the cross. You say, "My God I love You." Your Faith saves you. You are Christ-like.

Nobody, only God, knows how much you suffer. Your cross is very heavy. Drop into a church and make the stations-take this with you as a guide. You pray:

- 1. I am falsely accused, unjustly condemned look at Christ.
- 2. My Cross is heavy.
- 3. I fell, I need Patience.
- 4. Blessed Mother Help me.
- I must help others.
 I must say thanks.
- 7. I need courage and confidence to go on.
- 8. I don't need sympathy.
- 9. Perseverance.
- 10. I must be stripped of all sinful attachments.
- When Christ was nailed to the Cross, all He could do was to suffer and pray (Stand here an extra moment)
- 12. Grace of a Happy Death.
- 13. and 14. I put myself in Mary's keeping.

Practice Faith in an exceptional way in January and make it the foundation for all the Virtues of 1972 and years to come.
