THE MAKING OF A BOOK

Most of us who have never written a book stand in awe of authors. How were they able to put so many words and ideas together? Maybe some of us think that they just sat down at the typewriter and the words came as easily as getting water from a tap. That may be for some type of books, but certainly not for history or biography.

As a case in point, take "The Cheerful Ascetic," the life of Father Francis Xavier Seelos, C.SS.R., written by Father Michael J. Curley, C.SS.R., of Brooklyn, New York. The printed text of this life covers 314 pages. There are 87 pages of references and notes, and the bibliography takes 13 pages. Five drafts were made before the printer ever saw it.

When the material for this book was recently shipped from Brooklyn to the Father Seelos Center in New Orleans, it took a station wagon loaded with 14 large boxes to carry it all. When one considers the time alone it took to amass that much material, it is staggering.

Before the material started on its long journey, six full days were spent in duplicating approximately 9000 pages of original documents. The retracing of the steps of Father Seelos' pilgrimage in life from Fussen, Bavaria, where he was born to New Orleans where he died, to all the places where he was stationed: Baltimore, Annapolis, Cumberland, Pittsburgh and to all the places where he said Mass, or preached, the visits to city, state and federal archives both in Europe and the U.S.A., the poring over documents in dusty files, the tracing down of letters written by Father Seelos over a century ago, the traveling of thousands of miles - all this went into the neat and readable package we call "THE CHEER-FUL ASCETIC."

Our hats are off and our hearts are grateful to the one man who put it all together, Father Curley!

Virtue for the month of July: OBEDIENCE

Patron: St. Philip, the Apostle

Text: You are my friends if you do the things I command you. (John 5/14)

Father Seelos used to say to be obedient one must have lots of good, simple Faith and be humble. He was a good observant Religious because he possessed these two great virtues in an eminent degree. He saw Christ in his Superiors, he saw the Will of God in his Holy Redemptorist Rule, he heard the voice of God in the ringing of the Community bell calling him to the spiritual exercises of the day. In his faith and humility he obeyed blindly. He summed up all humility in one word: Truth. Truth is: I am what I am in the eyes of God and nothing more. All that I have, I have from God.

Because he was obedient he was happy. All eternal and temporal woes come from disobedience. The rebellious Angels of Heaven lost their principalities when they shouted against God: We will not serve You. They became devils and hell was created. Because of the disobedience of Adam and Eve we have all the sorrows of life. The proud today lack faith and humility and are disobedient to God and all lawful authority. They live by the philosophy: I am what I am in my own opinion, all that I have, I have by my own ability. Nobody is going to tell me what to do.

Father Seelos loved the Holy Father. He saw the Pope as Vicar of Christ on earth. When his Holiness spoke, his word was final.

The cry of man today is that of Pharo to Moses: Who is this God that I should hear His voice! God speaks throught the Church: You must go to Mass on Sunday! You must receive the Sacraments. The answer is: Who is this God that I should hear His voice!

Let us pray that our youth have the correct balance in life - to render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's. All is easy with faith and humility. Obedience spells happiness.

My dear reader! How do you practice obedience! Do you find fault with the Church and her priests and criticize them? Check. Do you see the Will of God in everything and accept joys and sorrows in the spirit of obedience-God's will.

To see obedience in all its perfection, read the life of our Lord as the Evangelists tell it to us. Christ was the most obedient of men and He was a God.

Pray to the Blessed Mother of God who was so obedient, for the grace to be obedient to lawful authority -- the Church and the State.
