The time of the Mass will be 11:30 a.m. Most Reverend Harold R. Perry, S.V.D., D.D., auxiliary bishop of the archdiocese of New Orleans, will be the principal concelebrant of the Mass. Rev. George Corbett, C.SS.R., of Glenview, Illinois, will be the homilist.

All are invited to attend this anniversary Mass.

There will be parking on the school playgrounds on St. Andrew Street.

#### HOW TO SPEND THE DAY WITH GOD

Virtue for October: Recollection

Patron: St. Simon, Apostle

Text: And having dismissed the crowd, Jesus went into the mountains alone,

to pray. (Matt. 14/23)

We live in a world of a thousand distractions, day after day. Rarely during the day do we think of the good God. Isn't that true? If we wish to change this, to be recollected, to live in the presence of God, to talk to Him often, as we work and even as we play, we must have reminders to pray around us. Father Seelos spent his early years, up to his 24th, when he came to America, in a Catholic town, where there were crucifixes and shrines at the street corners and along the mountain sides. He was not afraid nor ashamed to kneel at these holy reminders and say a prayer. His Catholic home was filled with these sacred images. (Your home?) In this way he learned early in life to be recollected. When he became a Redemptorist he found these reminders all over the house. The word SILENCE in big letters was on the walls of the corridors. It was a reminder to talk less to man - to talk more to God. Your lifestyle calls for much talking. I) However, wouldn't it be wonderful if you could get away from the noise and distractions of the world and make a retreat of a few days in some religious house, to be alone with God? 2) Maybe you could organize a group of people and make monthly Days of Recollection in some quiet church. 3) Surely you can visit the Blessed Sacrament in your neighborhood from time to time, possibly daily, and sit and talk with your God about time and eternity. That's recollection at its best. 4) Find a few minutes daily to dialogue with your crucifix. Meditate on this thought: When Jesus was nailed to the cross He could do but two things till He died — to suffer and to pray. That's everybody's life in miniature. 5) "MY GOD I LOVE YOU" ALL DAY LONG.

Be recollected for a few minutes daily as you say your Rosary and meditate with the Blessed Mother on the Fifteen mysteries. CARRY YOUR ROSARY ALWAYS. IT'S A REMINDER.
