ALL SANCTITY IN TWO WORDS: LOVE OF GOD, WILL OF GOD

(Father Grangell's Monthly Conference)

Virtue for July: Obedience - the Will of God

Patron Saint: St. Philip, the Apostle

Scripture Text: You are my friends if you do the things I command you.

(St. John 15/14)

Father Seelos used to say he loved his religious vocation so much because he was privileged to live in the same house with the Blessed Sacrament. He could visit his Eucharistic God as often as he desired and stay with Him as long as he could. Sometimes his visits were just: My God I love You. At other times they were from the little "Visit Book" of St. Alphonsus. The prayer he carried away from the Visit Book which he made his own was: All that I ask and desire is Thy Holy Love, final perseverance and the perfect accomplishment of Thy Holy Will! Notice—it's Love of God, Will of God. One of his daily visits to the Chapel was to make the Way of the Cross. He used the repetitious prayer of St. Alphonsus at each station, which was the breath of his life: Grant that I may love Thee always, and then do with me as Thou wilt! Notice—it's Love of God, Will of God.

When the Blessed Virgin Mary was told by the Angel that she was chosen to be the Mother of God, she proved she loved God by her willingness to do His Will. Her acceptance: "Be it done unto me according to Thy Word!"

Our Lord taught us to say in the "Our Father" — Thy Will be done on earth as it is in heaven, Matt. 6/10. If everybody always did the Will of God, earth would be heaven. The Will of God for all men is the Ten Commandments.

Just think for a moment! There would be no stealing, no murders, no suicides, no hatred, no adultery, no abuse of sex, not even a bad thought or desire, no sins of the tongue, no evil of any kind, if the Ten Commandments were kept by all men all over the earth. Think of that.

Another thought! There would be no sickness, no physical suffering, no death, if Adam had not been disobedient to the one and only commandment God had given to him. He ate of the forbidden fruit and we, his children, are suffering for his disobedience.

Another thought! See your crucifix! The Infinite Son of God is paying the penalty for finite man's disobedience. Hear Him pray: Father, forgive them for they know not what they do! Man will never know what sin, what disobedience really is.

A last thought! We must obey the Church. The greatest sin of disobedience by a Catholic is to miss Holy Mass deliberately on Sunday — the greatest, because of the bad example given to others, causing others to commit mortal sin and maybe losing their Faith.
