Excerpt from THE CHEERFUL ASCETIC

"He (Francis Xavier Seelos) was an obliging youngster with an habitually amiable disposition. He had a generous and pious nature, without a single streak of malice. One of Francis' fellow pupils at the Fussen school testified that nobody was more diligent and better behaved than Francis, who was a favorite with everyone. During these early school years Xavier, as he was generally called, became an altar boy and tried to serve as many Masses as possible. He constructed a little altar at home, and his favorite recreation was to conduct church services, with his playmates acting as the congregation around the altar. While there was a definite tendency toward religious practices, indicating the dawning of a religious vocation, it does not appear to have been clear and explicit. One of the happiest events of those early years

was the occasion of his receiving the sacrament of confirmation from Bishop Ignatius Albert von Riege of Augsburg on September 3, 1828; he made his First Communion a year and a half later in 1830."

LOVE GOD! LOVE GOD!

(Father Grangell's Monthly Conference)

Virtue for March: LOVE OF GOD

Text: Love God with thy whole being (Mark 12/30)

Patron: St. James, the Greater

Bible scholars go into ecstacy when reading the fabulous 13th chapter of 1st Corinthian. St. Paul devotes the whole chapter to the LOVE OF GOD and ends the chapter with the words: Now, there remain faith, hope and charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity. Paul uses the word CHARITY for LOVE OF GOD.

This was the teaching of Christ. When asked by a learned scribe which was the first and greatest law, what is man's first duty, his first obligation toward God, Christ answered: THOU SHALT LOVE THE LORD, THY GOD, WITH THY WHOLE HEART, THY WHOLE SOUL, THY WHOLE MIND AND ALL THY STRENGTH. God wants everything – not a part, not an occasion – just everything, always.

Father Seelos meditated in a big way on the love of God in the third month of the year. He put the LOVE OF GOD in the third station of the Way of the Cross. As we saw, Father Seelos put the virtue of Faith in the First Station. He meditates on how his will must be the will of God. He kept the will of God very active in his life through the virtue of Faith. He heard God speaking to him all day long with the ears and the heart of Faith. In the second station of HOPE, he prayed and desired and resolved to be a saint. Now in the third station is LOVE OF GOD. There are three great virtues, FAITH, HOPE AND LOVE OF GOD. Of these three LOVE OF GOD IS THE GREATEST.

St. Alphonsus, a doctor of the church, the leading theologian of the 17th century, the founder of the Redemptorists, wrote one hundred eleven books, one was entitled SELVA meaning "The Forest". It is for priests .The whole book is on the Love of God. It is a long book of 469 pages.

In one place he says: Let us see the MEANS to be employed for belonging entirely to God. This is what we must do to practice PERFECT LOVE OF GOD:

- We must have a great desire to love God. Whisper all day long MY GOD I LOVE YOU. Give me grace to love you perfectly.
- The intention of pleasing God must motivate all our actions to go to Holy Mass and Holy Communion, to pray, to work – everything.
- Be Ready to suffer anything, everything, mental and bodily, insults, false accusations, humiliations.
- Perfect conformity to the will of God, resigned to God's will in all things. Keep smiling, spread sunshine constantly. You say this is hard. Indeed, it is, but it is all for God.
- 5. Love the Blessed Mother.

There are three billion people in the world. The big majority have never heard of God. Millions have heard of God but are careless, indifferent about religion. Some live in your house. Godless people!!! My good God, I offer up to you the every thought, word and deed of these three billion people as so many acts of love of You and sorrow for having offended You.

Mary, great Mother of God, love God for those who never say MY GOD I LOVE YOU.

In the third station of the Way of the Cross we see Jesus fall, pulled and beaten to His feet. (Pause) This was His human body. We fall into sin because of the weakness of our bodies, the power of passion. Dear God, give me the grace to fall deeper and deeper in love with, You, never into sin.

The Patron Saint of the month – St. James Major! He was a favorite apostle of Christ. We read so often in the Gospel about Peter, James and John. We saw the Transfiguration of our Lord on Mount Tabor. He was taken into the rocks and trees of the garden, close to our Lord in His agony. Ask him to help you to love God.
