FATHER SEELOS AND SANCTITY

Virtue for November: Prayer Patron: St. Jude Thaddeus

Text: We ought always to pray and not to faint. (Luke 18/1)

The virtue of recollection of last month prepares us for the virtue of this month: PRAYER. St. Alphonsus defined prayer: PRAYER IS THE RAISING OF THE MIND AND HEART TO GOD, IN ORDER TO OBTAIN SOME GRACE FROM HIM.

To pray properly it is not sufficient to recite mechanically and without attention some formula that is more or less pious. To be true, prayer must be the expression of a sincere desire, and the more ardent this desire is, the more fervently will our prayer come forth from the heart to ascend to God. Words are not necessary when the heart alone presents its petition to God.

Father Seelos, in a letter to his mother, wrote: "Prayer is the best medicine which conquers every pain." To a young lady planning to enter religious life he wrote: "A vocation and perseverance are special favors from God and can be obtained by prayer only." To his seminarians he said "What can console you in times of depresssion...seeing your own imperfections? ... The immediate application of the holy exercise of prayer. This exercise knows how to cure our daily wounds."

In his biography of Father Seelos, Father Curley writes that the virtue of confidence was in his prayers. In asking God to cure people of bodily disease and especially of moral defects, Seelos seemed to have no doubt that his prayers would be answered. On several occasions in Pittsburg when people brought their sick children to him, he would say a prayer over them before the altar of our Blessed Mother with such calm assurance that the bystanders were struck by it. They were even more surprised when those for whom he prayed were cured of their disorders.

When praying Father Seelos would always kneel erect with his hands folded. However, he did not consider kneeling essential to prayer, and he would quote St. John Chrysostom who said: "Even if you don't bend the knee, nor strike your breast, nor elevate your hands toward heaven, if only you bring to God an inflamed heart, nothing is wanting in your prayer."

Father Seelos said he wanted to be a spiritual man, and he knew that prayer would be his chief strength. He was most regular at all the spiritual exercises mandated by his Redemptorist rule, and even as he moved about the church and rectory and the sidewalks of his parish, he would engage himself in prayer.
