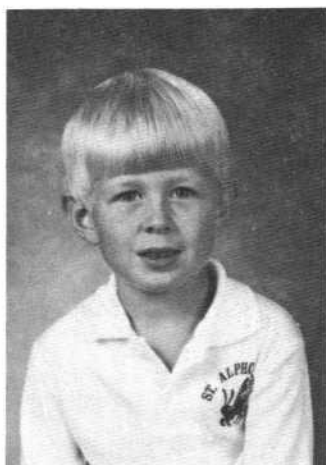

Recent visitors to St. Mary's Church and tomb and museum of Father Seelos, were these two bright-eyed children, together with other members of their families. They are first cousins. They came to see and to pray and to thank Father Seelos for his intercession. The mother of one of them has written, "Father Seelos has intervened for us so many times and often favors are granted in very unusual and unexpected ways. Our family is large and someone always seems to have a serious problem. . . We are always calling on him to help pray for us and he always seems to intercede for us."

SAINT ALPHONSUS AND HOPE

St. Alphonsus founded the Congregation of the Redemptorists in southern Italy in 1732. He was a preacher of parish missions, the superior of a group of missionaries, a confessor of renown, a writer, a theologian, a poet, a lawyer, an artist, to list a few of his accomplishments. At the age of 67 he was made bishop of the diocese of St. Agatha of the Goths. His health was never robust. He was anointed seven times in his long life of nearly 92 years. Not too long after his death he was declared a saint, then a doctor of the Church, and just lately the patron of confessors and moralists.

He was respected and revered by all who came in contact with him. Yet in his old age he was beset with scrupulosity and assailed with doubts of his eternal salvation. Despite these trials, St. Alphonsus was full of confidence. He often prayed, "O my Jesus, it seems as though I must wait a thousand years until I have the happiness of beholding Thee in heaven."

His confidence was based on the goodness of God, the merits of Jesus Christ, and the protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He was accustomed to say over and over again, "My Jesus. Thou art my hope; Mary, my Mother, all my confidence rests in thee." He would say, "When temptations assail us, we have no other recourse than to abandon ourselves into the hands of God. All other means are deceitful."

As holy a man as he was, in his declining years he was tempted to despair. When so afflicted, he would pray from the Psalms, "In Thee, O Lord, I have hoped; let me never be put to confusion."

St. Alphonsus' whole life was filled with struggles, beginning with the one to leave the world and enter religious life. The early years of his fledgling Congregation were filled with disappointments. All his first companions left him. This did not deter him. He felt that it was God's will that he should found this society, and he trusted that God would provide.

He even found himself excluded from the Congregation he had founded. He was sick a good part of his life. However, his hope was ever in God. On one occasion he said, "God is a Master who will not allow Himself to be surpassed in kind services." Before his life came to an end, he saw his little Congregation of priests and brothers begin to spread in this world, he felt the cessation of his interior struggles, and in peace he gave his soul to God.
