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FÜSSEN REMEMBERS FATHER SEELOS

Füssen is a small but beautiful winter resort town in the Bavarian Alps. It could well be the Aspen or Vail of that area. It also happens to be the birthplace of Francis Xavier Seelos, who may well be its most famous citizen.

Father's picture hangs prominently at the entrance to the parish church of St. Mang, where he was baptized on the very day of his birth, January 11, 1819.

PURITY

It is truly remarkable that in this day and age, the word, purity, or chastity or abstinence from sexual activity, has made a comeback in, of all places, the secular press. Heretofore, when anyone suggested chastity or abstinence as a means to correct some of the ills of the world, he or she was greeted with laughter and ridicule. After all this is the era of the so-called sexual revolution, and all traditional family ethics are on hold. However, to give credit where credit is due, the press is merely reporting what some prominent people are thinking and saying.

Sex is a gift of God to the whole person. He made us male and female, men and women. The Church teaches us that sex is a gift to be shared between husband and wife bound together in holy matrimony. Abstinence is required of those who are not married.

In his book, *Following Christ*, a handbook of Catholic moral teaching, Father Daniel L. Lowery, C.SS.R., has this description of purity, and I summarize him:

Purity is not the greatest of virtues, charity is the greatest. But purity is very closely related to holiness. St. Paul reminds us, "God has not called us to immorality but to holiness" (I Thessalonians, 4/7).

Purity is a demanding virtue, because it deals with the capital vice of lust. The pull of the concupiscence of the flesh is great.

Purity is a liberating virtue. It frees us from the lusts we experience, it frees us from the slavery of concupiscence. St. Paul tells us, "The law of the spirit, the spirit of life in Christ Jesus, has freed you from the law of sin and death" (Romans, 8/2).

It is worthwhile to repeat in this connection the means of preserving purity long endorsed by the spiritual writers of the Church: 1) the practice of self-denial; 2) avoiding the occasions of sin, persons, places, objects that can lead one into sin; 3) prayer in the time of temptation, and prayer to our Blessed Mother; 4) frequent reception of the sacraments of reconciliation and Holy Communion.
