

FATHER SEELOS AT ST. MARY'S, DETROIT

Father Seelos spent but ten months in St. Mary's, Detroit. He came in November of 1865 and left for New Orleans in September of 1866. Although he was absent often from the parish giving retreats and other spiritual exercises, his name is still found frequently in the baptismal and marriage records. On his leaving, his superior was astounded to see the long list of sick calls to the sick poor. Bishop Lefevere said, "I am sorry Father Seelos must leave my diocese, for one has only to look at him to know he is a saint."

GOD FIRST LOVED US

"On one occasion a lawyer stood up to pose this problem: 'Teacher, what must I do to inherit everlasting life?' Jesus answered him: 'What is written in the law? How do you read it?' He replied: 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself" (Luke, 10/25-27).

We should love God because God has first loved us. St. John says, "Love, then, consists in this: not that we have loved God but that He has loved us, and has sent us His own Son as an offering for our sins" (IJohn, 4/10).

Out of the billions and billions of creatures God could have created, from all eternity He has chosen each one of us to live here on earth. He has willed us to be born at this time in history. He has surrounded us with family and friends.

The thief, crucified on the right of Jesus, reprimanded his fellow criminal on the left for the abuse He leveled at Jesus. And then, turning to Jesus, he whispered a prayer, "Remember me, Lord, when you enter upon Your reign." He got the answer we would all love to hear at the end of our days, "This day you will be with Me in paradise" (Luke, 23/39-43). Even Judas at the moment of his treason could have received pardon and mercy from the Lord. As he came forward in the garden that night to plant the kiss that would indicate the Redeemer, Jesus did not repel him but greeted him with the words, "Friend, do what you are here for" (Matt. 26/50).
