FATHER SEELOS' MUSEUM

It is nearly four years since the Father Seelos Museum was inaugurated so auspiciously. Thousands of people, parishioners, tourists from all parts of the world, have now passed through its doors. Perhaps the most interesting "relic" of his life is paradoxically one he really never knew during his lifetime. It is his first casket, made of iron and now encrusted with rust. His remains were brought up in 1902 during the course of the diocesan investigation into the holiness of his life. and duly authenticated. It is now 123 years since the Servant of God died and was buried in St. Mary's Church The church was crowded for his wake and funeral and it is still so for his memorial Mass on the first Sunday of each October.



THE WILL OF GOD IN THE LIFE OF FATHER SEELOS

Even before he became a Redemptorist, Francis Seelos saw God's will in his acceptance as a candidate for the Redemptorist congregation in America. It so corresponded to the inner call of God he felt. To explain his resolve to go immediately to America without returning to his home in Füssen, he wrote to his brother, Adam, "It is God's holy will that I go to the land which I have shown you many times during the summer on the maps when we were alone, and I was able to show you many things that will be useful to your future life. If this concerned me alone, I would always remain with you and the family, but I cannot resist the inner call, and I will not oppose it but freely follow it."

In 1857 when he was pastor of St. Alphonsus in Baltimore, a blood vessel broke in his throat, and for three days the blood flowed. Fears were entertained that if this should continue his life was well in danger. He calmly made an act of resignation to God's will and was ready for anything that might happen.

Brother Louis Kenning, a member of the Redemptorist community at St. Mary's in New Orleans from its beginning, knew Father Seelos as a holy man from the days of his novitiate and was with Seelos often during his last days on earth. He asked the sick man to tell the ways and means of acquiring personal sanctification and the pleasure of God. This is what Father told him;

"I think the best way is to accept the Will of God, to obey faithfully and quietly the order of one's superior and do the work assigned him."

Brother Louis offered his own life to God if Father Seelos would be spared. Thoroughly aroused, Seelos cried, "No, not that." His arguments failed to convince the sick priest, who said, "If God demands the sacrifice of my life, willingly will I make it. The Will of God and my own soul are dearer to me than all the souls in the world."

Let us ask his intercession that we may always seek God's will in all that we do as did good Father Seelos!
