

ANNUAL MEMORIAL MASS - OCTOBER 6

The annual memorial Mass for Father Francis Xavier Seelos, C.SS.R., once the acting pastor of St. Mary's Assumption Church, will be celebrated in that church on October 6. The time of the Mass is 11:30 A.M.. The Provincial of the Redemptorists of the St. Louis Province, Father James Shea, will be the principal concelebrant and homilist at the Mass. After the ceremony there will be veneration of the mission crucifix once worn by Father Seelos. There will also be a reception in the garden of St. Mary's immediately after the Mass.

Father Shea, a native of Wisconsin, is the superior of all the Redemptorists in the midwest,

the southern states from Alabama to New Mexico, and the Redemptorists in the vice-province of Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil, and in the vice-province of Bangkok, Thailand. He was ordained in 1965 in Oconomowoc, Wisconsin, and has served as pastor of parishes in Kirkwood, Missouri and Minneapolis, Minnesota.

SILENCE AND SOLITUDE

Jesus spent forty days and nights in prayer and fasting in the desert at the onset of His public life. He invited His disciples to come apart with Him in a desert place to rest awhile. When they found their world too distracting, the Christians of the early centuries, like St. Anthony of Egypt, fled to the desert to be alone with their God.

Around the turn of the century Charles de Foucald, a baptized Catholic who as a young man fell away from the faith, on his return to the practice of his youth, went off to the Sahara desert. There alone before the Blessed Sacrament he sought to attract his desert neighbors to the faith. He was killed by bandits but his efforts brought others to take his place.

St. John Vianney has been named the patron saint of parish priests. Rightly so, because well over a hundred and fifty years ago he made the humble village of Ars a remarkable center of Christlike activity. He spent unbelievable hours on end in the confessional. He had been slow to learn in the seminary, but his sermons, simple and direct, spoke eloquently to the hearts of his hearers. People came from all over France and beyond to listen to him preach and then wait patiently in long lines to make their confessions to him.

In spite of the evident success of his ministry in Ars, his soul was so tried that on three occasions he fled his parish hoping to come to rest in the desert. Somehow or other he was always brought back to the place of his many trials and also his triumphs.

Speech is a gift of God to us rational creatures to enable us to communicate with one another. This faculty can be abused by many sins: blasphemy, curses, anger, impurity, lies, slander, detraction. On the other hand, we have the saying the kindly word unspoken is a sin. Wisely does Ecclesiastes in the old testament advise us that "there is a time for everything . . . a time to speak and a time to be silent" (Eccl. 3, 1a & 7b).

St. Teresa of Avila viewed solitude (engendered by silence) as being so necessary for all who wish to lead a serious prayer life. In these days of increased decibels of sound, it is difficult to find a place of quiet. We cannot all flee to the desert. Look for a moment of peace in the early morning hours or later in the evening, before or after Mass in a quiet church. Place yourself in God's presence and let the waves of silence wash over your mind and heart.
