



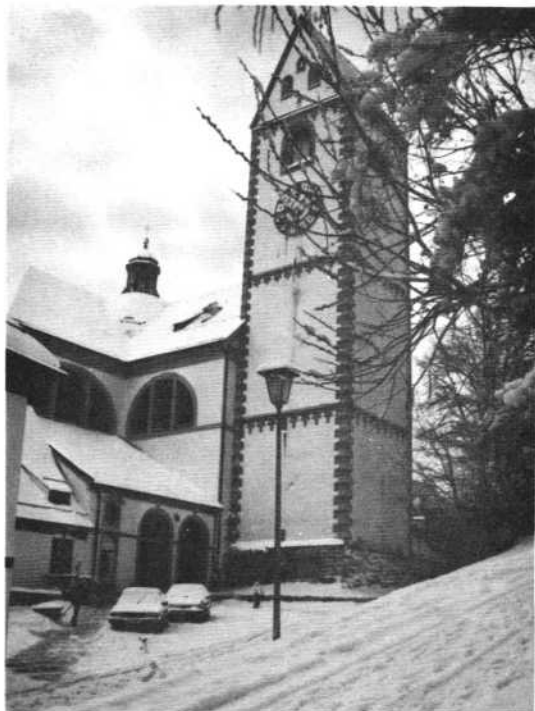

SELFLESSNESS

If the definition of selflessness means something like giving oneself second place or preferring another or others to oneself, it is doubtful that the idea will ever be popular. However unpopular the idea may be, it is certain that the giving of oneself was not foreign to the practice of Jesus Christ nor was it absent from His teaching. In regard to the second Person of the Holy Trinity becoming man, St. Paul put it so trenchantly, "Though He was in the form of God, He did not deem equality with God something to be grasped at. Rather, He emptied Himself and took the form of a slave, being born in the likeness of men. He was known to be of human estate, and it was thus He humbled Himself, obediently accepting even death, death on a cross!" (Phil. 2, 6-8).

What Jesus preached about selflessness is found in the fifteenth chapter of the gospel according to John, "There is no greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15/14). St. Mark tells us that "Jesus

summoned the crowd with His disciples and said to them: 'If a man wishes to come after Me, he must deny his very self, take up his cross, and follow in My steps. Whoever would preserve his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will preserve it' (Mark, 8/34-35).

Selflessness has certainly been a part of the Christian tradition from its earliest days, from the days of St. Stephen, the deacon-martyr, from the time of the apostles to the time of the church in the catacombs, and to our own day. The world itself applauds unselfish actions, the fireman who rescues an infant from a burning house, the sailor who gives his place to another in the lifeboat, the mother who perishes protecting her young one.

We admire the saints and make them our heroes because they knew how to sacrifice themselves for others. How many people owe their faith to the unselfishness of St. Francis Xavier, who turned his back on a worldly career to bring the word of God to the east. What selflessness there was in the soul of the Little Flower, St. Therese of Lisieux, who offered up her suffering for the conversion of the world! We have the example of St. Maximillian Kolbe who changed places with a man condemned to death in Auschwitz.

Let us not forget the hidden heroes of our lives who without headlines have given of themselves for the spiritual and temporal good of those they loved!
