## **FATHER SEELOS MEMORIAL MASS, OCTOBER 1**

On Sunday, October 1, the annual memorial Mass for Father Francis Xavier Seelos, C.SS.R., will be celebrated at 11:30 A.M. in St. Mary's Assumption Church (on the corner of Josephine and Constance Street in the Irish Channel of New Orleans). The principal celebrant of the Mass will be Father Monroe Perrier, C.SS.R., and the homilist will be Father John Hensgen, C.SS.R. The mission crucifix of Father Seelos will be venerated after the Mass. A reception will be held in the garden of St. Mary's after the cermonies.

Father Perrier, a native New Orleanian, is the vice-provincial of the Redemptorists of the New Orleans vice-province. Father Hensgen, St. Louis-born, is a veteran

missionary and now is stationed in Biloxi, Mississippi.

Father Seelos died in St. Mary's rectory on October 4, 1867. His earthly remains lie in the sanctuary's Church. His cause for sainthood progresses both here in America and Rome.

### "CHEERFUL ASCETIC"

One thing Francis Seelos was not was a sorry saint. His biographer, Father Michael Curley, C.SS.R., was moved to name him "the cheerful ascetic." Francis grew up in the place of his birth, Fussen, Bavaria. He learned his prayers from his mother. His father was sacristan of the parish church and he loved to traipse after him as he performed his duties. He admired the statues and the tabernacle where he learned Jesus was present in the Blessed Sacrament. At an early age he longed to be a saint like his patron, St. Francis Xavier, the great Jesuit missionary.

In his spiritual development he soon learned the necessity of practicing mortification in the ancient tradition of the saints. Witnesses testify that his great act of mortification was to sleep on the floor. They saw his bed littered with papers and books during the day and saw it again in the same condition in the early morning.

When he was in Detroit he asked his superior permission to sleep on the floor

but was refused for reasons of health.

However much he practiced mortification in utmost privacy, he heeded the injunction of the Lord not to let the world know he was doing it. He did it with a cheerful face. Hence, the title of his life, "Cheerful Ascetic."

In his letter to his two sisters he revealed his idea of mortification and self-

denial, saying:

In your holy and enviable vocation you must persevere with fervor and joy. The more fervor we exercise, the more God and the Blessed Virgin will assist us. Everything becomes lighter in the degree in which we do violence to ourselves. We must strive to embrace the crosses which God sends us with a willing, even joyful heart. We must prefer the sufferings He sends to those penances which we like to choose for ourselves.

We may summarize Father Seelos' thoughts on mortification in this way: 1) be constant, persevere; 2) practice mortification cheerfully, not with a sorry face; 3) pray to Jesus and Mary for the strength and courage to continue; 4) choose rather the crosses that come our way in daily life rather than ones of our own choosing.

The crosses which come with God's permission come in many forms: the weather, whether it is hot or cold; our food, tasty or tasteless; our health, good or poor; our talents, with their limitations; our strengths and joys, our sufferings, our failures

and successes, our good fortune, our frustrations, and even death itself.

Mortification, despite its bad press, has a place in our spiritual life. Father Seelos practiced it without calling undue attention to it and always with a smile. Can we do no less?
