HIS MISSION CRUCIFIX

Although he was a priest for less than 24 years and spent many years as pastor and in the education of future Redemptorists, Father Francis Seelos still found time to preach parish missions in many parts of our country. In his career he preached to people in the dioceses of Alton, Altoona-Johnstown, Baltimore, Belleville, Bridgeport, Buffalo, Chicago, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Grand Rapids, Hartford, Harrisburg, Joliet, Natchez, Newark, New York, Peoria, Philadelphia, Providence, Rockville, St. Louis, Scranton, Toledo, Youngstown, Wheeling. An impressive list! Wherever he preached, Father Seelos wore this crucifix. Moreover, he preached in three languages: English, German, and French.

SURRENDER

Surrender is a sad word, even frightening at times, and so often devastating. Robert E. Lee, famous general though he was, must have felt all these emotions that fateful day at Appomattox in 1865. However, surrender does not always have to bring sadness into our lives. Surrender, in the sense of submitting oneself to the will of another, can be, under the proper conditions, a most pleasing and rewarding experience.

For example, there is Abraham, a giant figure in the history of the Jewish people. He is, indeed, as we pray in the first eucharistic prayer of the Mass, "our father in faith." When God called on Abraham to leave his homeland, his kindred, and journey to the land that the Lord would show him, he was already advanced in years. The Lord promised that the land would be flowing with milk and honey, that he would be the father of a great nation, and that he and his wife, Sara, would have a child.

After many years of disappointments and trials, their child, Isaac, was born to their complete joy. But the Lord was not finished with Abraham. Now He would ask him to sacrifice his son's life. Even then Abraham surrendered his will to the Lord and was willing to give his son back to God, all the time hoping against hope that the Lord would provide another victim. Tested again and again, even beyond our human understanding, Abraham trusted in God and in the end all God's promises to him were fulfilled. (Continued on next page)

A second example of holy surrender to God is the Virgin Mary of Nazareth. She was visited by God's messenger, the archangel Gabriel. God had chosen her to be the mother of His Son. As soon as she learned that this would be accomplished through the intervention of the Holy Spirit, she bowed her head in surrender to the will of God, "Be it done to me according to your word." Heaven's approval was immediate. "And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us." When Mary was presented with her vocation, she had at best a blurred picture of what the future would be, but she trusted in God and accepted His will.

After His last meal with His apostles, Jesus went to the garden of Gethsemani to pray. While there the weight of His sufferings and death began to weigh upon Him. He was in agony; distress and sadness oppressed Him. His sweat was as blood pouring forth from His body. He prayed to His Father: "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by. Still, let it be as You would have it, not as I" (Matthew 26:39). On the cross after three hours agony, Jesus uttered a loud cry and said, "Father, into Your hands I commend My spirit." Having said

this, He died. (Luke 23:46).

One of the beauties of God's creation is the order of the universe. The sun, the moon and the stars move through the heavens in measurable time. On our earth the seasons follow each other in regular order. Animals follow the instincts God has given them. Acorns become oaks. All creation obeys the laws of nature.

Of all creation only human beings have the faculty of free will. Only human beings can disobey God. On the other hand, only human beings have the ability to surrender their will to that of the Creator. Only we can consciously obey the will of God. We pray that it be ever thus.
