150 YEARS IN NEW ORLEANS

On Sunday, November 9, 1997, the Redemptorists celebrated their arrival 150 years ago in New Orleans with Mass in St. Mary's Assumption Church. The first community was sent by the then superior of Redemptorists in America, St. John Neumann, C.SS.R., later bishop of Philadelphia.

"BE NOT AFRAID"

That early spring afternoon the sun was shining fitfully through the broken clouds. An unruly mob had gathered on a knoll outside the city walls. Cursing and ribald shouts were heard from a closed group surrounding three men dying a violent death in penalty for their crimes, real and imagined. Directly beneath the cross in the middle stood several women and one young man, mourning the suffering and imminent death of their loved one. The dying man was Jesus. His friends were Mary His Mother, Mary Magdalene, Mary the wife of Clopas, and the apostle St. John. It was the first Good Friday.

Only a few days ago a crowd of followers had welcomed Jesus into the city and hailed Him as the son of David and placed their garments and palm branches beneath the hooves of the donkey that carried Him through the city streets. It was only a few hours ago that another crowd had cried for His death as Pilate presented them with a choice between Jesus and Barabbas.

Within the time limit of less than 24 hours the Savior had been taken prisoner, dragged to several sham trials during the night, confronted by the Roman governor, subjected to a cruel scourging, crowned with a close-fitting cap of thorns pressed into His skull, mocked and spit upon by unfeeling soldiers. All bloody and covered with spittle and dirt, He was made a spectacle to the mob, and then the mob, incited by His enemies, shouted "Crucify Him!"

I have often wondered what was going through St. John's mind as he watched his Master dying a shameful death, totally innocent of any crime. Did he recall the warnings Jesus had made, often enough, about going to Jerusalem and suffering and dying and rising again? Was he, like the other apostles, still wondering what

Jesus meant by saying "on the third day I will rise again"?

John and his brother James had once a vision of their position of power in the kingdom they dreamed of Jesus founding. This dream was quickly fading in this late afternoon. All his hopes were dashed. Yet this was the time for him to recall the message Jesus had given them as they were completing their last supper together: "I tell you all this that in Me you may find peace. You will suffer in this world. But take courage. I have overcome the world" (John 14:33). Was it there and then on Calvary that John began to see the gloom of Good Friday fade into the triumph of Easter Sunday?

If there is one cause for despondency across the world, perhaps it could be the surfeit of news that pounds upon us day after day. Most of the news is bad, rarely is it good, and now with the internet added to television, radio, and all the other sources of news, at the end of any given day, we can literally be overwhelmed with sadness. An earthquake in Italy or the Andes, a hurricane in Mexico, a famine in Africa, a war in the Balkans, a typhoon in the Far East, a volcano erupting in the Caribbean, a revolution in the south Pacific — that is just the world news. Now for the national and regional news: murders, rapes, kidnappings, robberies, quarrels, accidents, political debates, muggings, car-jackings, and on and on. Is it any wonder that so many of us say, what is this world coming to?

When we add this world-misery to our own baggage of past sins, present temptations and worries, and always the uncertainties of life today, we could be inclined to be despondent. Yet there is always hope. Be not afraid, Jesus told us: "I have overcome the world." Our hope rests in Him and on His power, mercy and His fidelity to His

promises. "Be not afraid."
