BISHOP GILBERT TO CELEBRATE ANNIVERSARY MASS, OCTOBER 3

Bishop Edward J. Gilbert, C.SS.R., of the diocese of Roseau on the island of Dominica, West Indies, will be the main celebrant and homilist at the memorial Mass for Father Seelos. The annual Mass is scheduled for 11:30 A.M. on Sunday, October 3 in St. Mary's Assumption Church.

The mission crucifix of Father Seelos will be venerated after the Mass. A reception will be held in St. Mary's garden immediately following the ceremonies. St. Mary's Church is on the corner of Josephine and Constance Streets in the Irish Channel.

Bishop Gilbert, a native of Brooklyn, New York, taught in the Redemptorist Seminary in Esopus, N.Y., was the provincial of the Baltimore province for several terms and just recently was named as bishop of Roseau, the commonwealth of Dominica.

"I LOOK TO THE MOUNTAIN"

Capped in snow, shrouded in mist, bathed in golden sunshine, mountains present themselves as a challenge to the traveler, alluring to the climber, mysterious to the

philosopher, a thing of beauty to us all. For God in the revelation of Himself to us a mountain was the meeting-place.

Jesus, the Son of God made-man, had to prepare His followers for the bad news of His impending death by crucifixion. He took three of His apostles, Peter, James and John, up to a high mountain, Mount Tabor. While they were there He was transfigured before them. His garments became dazzingly white and a bright light shone around Him. The apostles were literally

dazed with this brilliance. When they came to their senses, they saw Jesus conversing with Moses and Elijah, the Old Testament representatives of the Law and the Prophets.

They were speaking of His death in Jerusalem.

Moses was called by God to lead the Israelites from the slavery of Egypt to the freedom of the Promised Land. Together for 40 years they wandered through the desert to Mount Sinai. It was on this mountain that Moses spoke with God and God revealed to him the Ten Commandments written on two tablets of stone.

The prophet Elijah fled for his life from his enemies and was fed miraculously by an angel of God and with this food and drink he had the strength to walk 40 days and nights to the mountain of God, Horeb. There he was told to await the word of the Lord.

"Then the Lord said, 'Go outside and stand on the mountain before the Lord; the Lord will be passing by.' A strong and heavy wind was rending the mountains and crushing rocks before the Lord – but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake – but God was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake there was fire – but God was not in the fire. After the fire there was a tiny whispering sound. When he heard this, Elijah hid his face in his cloak and went and stood at the entrance of the cave. A voice said to him, "Elijah, why are you here?" (I Kings 19:11-14).

After hours of teaching and laying hands on the sick, Jesus, the Gospels tell us, often went up to a mountain to pray. For us the mountains have a certain symbolism. Not all of us can retire to the mountains to pray. We can, however, divest ourselves, as it were, if the cares and troubles of the day. Wherever we are, on a mountain, by the seashore, making a retreat, going to church, merely retiring to our rooms, waking up early before the house is astir. Thus being recollected, we can, as Elijah, await the word of the Lord.

When I read the beautiful letter from the lady in Eunice, LA, it brought to mind an experience I had approximately one year ago after I had lost my glasses. Before retiring one night I recalled how my mother would ask Father Seelos to help her find "lost things." So I followed her custom.

One year ago before retiring for the night after looking for my glasses once again. I walked into the darkened parlor. I looked at one particular window and I

said out loud, "Father Seelos, where ARE my glasses?"

I turned away and walked directly to the bedroom. Then my husband and I heard a loud crash. The noise came through the intercom and we knew it came from the parlor. There we found the very window that I had looked at when I spoke to Father Seelos about my lost glasses had five panes broken to smithereens! We did not call the police. My husband secured the window with plywood, and we went back to bed.

The next morning we found out what broke the window. It was a large piece of concrete weighing seven or eight pounds. Someone had heaved it through the window and it hit the window frame rather than going through the window. It broke five window panes and put a dent in the frame. I saw immediately that Father Seelos saved me from serious injury or death.

I have thanked Father Seelos many times for protecting me that night.
