## BISHOP CLARENCE J. DUHART, C.S.S.R.

On September 21 of this past year, Bishop Duhart, born in New Orleans, died in Bangkok, Thailand. Long devoted to the cause of Father Seelos, he was a missionary in Thailand for fifty years. There he had been the superior of the founding community of Redemptorists and later on was the founding bishop of the diocese of Udonthani. Although blind and crippled by a stroke, he continued his missionary apostolate even in his last years... We commend his soul to your prayers.

### "IN GOD WE TRUST"

It is an anomaly in these modern times for us to have this motto engraved on our money, "In God We Trust." Currently we live under a warped interpretation of the First Amendment to our Constitution which forbids all mention of God or

religion. We know the First Amendment does not. I remember seeing in a shop this sign: "In God we trust - all others pay cash."

Seriously though, the word *trust* is a very important one in our vocabulary. Trust is the very bedrock of all our human relationships, and no more so than in our relationship with God our Creator and Savior. Trust on our part speaks more for the one who is trusted than it does for us. Trust is a compliment we pay to those in whom we place our confidence.

As I write this, a commercial is being shown on television. A young boy is pictured on a dock poised to jump into the water below. To give him confidence his father is standing waist-deep in the water with his arms open to catch him when he jumps. Great trust!

In the act of hope, we pray: "O my God, I hope in You. Trusting in Your promises, and because You are faithful, powerful and merciful, I hope for heaven, pardon of my sins, final perseverance and the glory of Paradise."

Who better than the Lord Himself to trust in? The Catechism of the Catholic Church quotes St. Teresa of Avila: "Hope, O my soul, hope, You know neither the day nor the hour. Watch carefully, for everything passes quickly, even though your impatience makes doubtful what is certain, and turns a very short time into a long one. Dream that the more you struggle, the more you prove the love that you bear your God, and the more you will rejoice with your Beloved in a happiness and rapture that can never end."

Jesus assures us of eternal life with God. He said: "You are My friends, if you do what I command you" (John 15:14). At the grave of Lazarus, Our Lord said: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in Me, though he should die, will come to life, and whoever is alive and believes in Me will never die" (John 11:25-26).

Whatever we need for our gaining eternal life, the Savior consoled us: "I give you My assurance, whatever you ask the Father, He will give you in My name" (John 16:23).

In the 15th chapter of the Gospel according to St. Luke, we read that Jesus related this parable to His hearers: "Who among you, if he has a hundred sheep and loses one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wasteland and follow the lost one until he finds it? Once arrived home he invites friends and neighbors in and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need to repent" (Luke 15:4-7).

The Prodigal Son! Who can ever forget the picture of the mercy and love and forgiveness of God for the repentant sinner painted in that masterful parable! The father rushes to welcome home the repentant prodigal and command a feast for him, because he was lost and now he was back home. (Luke 15:11-32).

St. Peter sums up for us the consolation of our hope: "Praised be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, He who in His great mercy gave us new birth; a birth unto hope which draws its life from the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead; a birth to an imperishable inheritance, incapable of fading or defilement, which is kept in heaven for you who are guarded with God's power through faith; a birth to a salvation which stands ready to be revealed in the last days" (I St. Peter 1:3-5).
