## A Miracle Waiting To Happen!

The city of New Orleans may have been an "accident waiting to happen." However, in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, there were several miracles waiting to happen through the intercession of Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos. First and foremost, all of the dedicated staff members at the Seelos Center survived the storm. While some staff and friends of the Seelos Cause lost everything they owned due to the breach in the levee, faith was not lost in our compassionate God and His heavenly saints!

Skilled German immigrants constructed St. Mary's Assumption Church in 1860. It has been an engineering feat that survived unnamed hurricanes over time. Forty years ago, Hurricane Betsy in 1965 caused considerable damage to the roof, but years later, the majestic church was reopened. Now, she survived a punishing Hurricane Katrina with no water damage, but there were isolated areas of wind damage to an ornamentation atop the bell tower and to a choir loft stairwell window on the Constance Street side of the church.

Thankfully, the National Shrine of Blessed Francis X. Seelos and the Seelos Museum remained intact. Significant sacred Father Seelos items that could be transported were taken out of New Orleans at the time of initial evacuation. However, when circumstances prevented the residents from returning to the city in a timely manner after the storm, it was decided that additional items should be retrieved from the Shrine for safekeeping. Only days after the storm, the Seelos Shrine Director was referred to Mark Hensgens, a high school classmate and member of the state Lieutenant Governor's office, who was aware that the Acadia Parish Sheriff's Department was organizing a humanitarian transport to New Orleans -- miraculously, within the hour! Lt. Dale Thibodeaux, Detective Chris McBride, Sgt. Anthony Lewis, all from Church Point, LA, along with Sgt. Jerome Landry and Sgt. Elijah Joseph of Crowley, LA, and Mr. Allen Davis of Harahan, LA, provided the assistance and protection to make the operation possible. Deputy Chief Walter Harrington and his Acadia Parish men in uniform are to be commended for their great service to the people of New Orleans.

The Redemptorists and staff at the National Shrine of Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos, C.Ss.R. are anxious to resume our vital ministry to the many people in need. On our part, we are committed to help rebuild a unique city that will again welcome pilgrims to the Shrine with hospitality, hope and healing.





#### TESTIMONIAL

#### LaPlace, LA

I am writing about a recent "happening" in my life that we can only attribute to the powerful intercession of our Blessed Seelos. I am a 29-year-old mother who was diagnosed with breast cancer four years ago when pregnant with my daughter. After 4 months of chemotherapy, my daughter was born in March 2002. We have been blessed with her perfect health.

Four months ago, I had a recurrence with breast cancer. It had spread to my ovaries and the doctors recommended a hysterectomy. We proceeded with the surgery and all was well. A routine CT scan in August showed spread of the cancer yet again to several bony areas throughout my body. My doctor recommended that we do another type of scan to verify the CT findings. That scan was scheduled for August 22.

On August 20, my husband and I were in New Orleans. Since I was diagnosed in 2001, several people suggested that I visit the Seelos Center. While looking for the D-Day Museum, we saw a sign on the side of a building that read "Seelos Shrine, Turn Here." We ended up at the Seelos Center on Constance Street. It was there that we met Anthony & Liz, two volunteers at the shrine.

Anthony immediately shared some of Fr. Seelos' miracles with us. Liz shared her personal testimony. We were amazed. They asked, "Are you in need of anything?" I then shared my story of a possible recurrence with breast cancer. My husband and I gladly accepted the invitation to pray with them, and, before I knew it, I was kneeling in front of the reliquary and holding Fr. Seelos' cross with several people praying over me. A peace swept over me, and I knew God was with us. We then obtained a first class relic to bring with me on the day of my second scan.

I had my second scan (a PET scan) done on August 22. As you may have already guessed, the results were clear. It did not detect any cancer in my body!
