SEELOS & THE SAINT-MAKING PROCESS

ince a formal procedure was established in 1588, the 1,338 beatifications and 482 canonizations by the late Pope John

Paul II outnumbered those of all his predecessors combined. According to Father Richard P. McBrien of Notre Dame University, "Many Catholics regarded that as one of John Paul II's greatest achievements because it highlighted his emphasis on spirituality. Others were less enthusiastic about the late pope's penchant for making so many new saints." What kind of mark is Pope Benedict XVI now putting on the saint-making process?

Unlike his predecessor, the new pontiff has already made a much

clearer distinction between beatification and canonization. Consequently, Benedict XVI has decided to forego presiding at the Mass at which candidates for beatification are elevated. Moreover, Benedict has insisted the candidate must "truly enjoy a firm and widespread reputation for holiness" that transcends boundaries of ethnic or national groups. Father Gabriel O'Donnell, O.P., the Postulator for the cause of Knights of Columbus founder Father Michael McGivney, says that Benedict's direction "is less about slowing things down and more

about being very careful and precise about the process." Others have similarly remarked that because Benedict is a scholar,

> this careful precision is of the utmost importance to him.

> The Holy Father also clarified the need for a candidate to be credited with "a physical miracle, since a moral miracle does not suffice." The Pope himself is looking for a "signal from God" in the form of a miracle to confirm the Church's judgment that the virtuous life of the candidate is authentic.

> How does all of this affect the one miracle needed to canonize Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos?

For Redemptorist Postulator General, Reverend Antonio Marrazzo, C.Ss.R., due to "the present state of things," any case must "present an immediate, complete and lasting healing in an evident and clear manner," in order for it to be declared "unquestionably inexplicable." He adds, "I am convinced that Blessed Francis Seelos will not lack 'making himself alive' in a case that is truly incontrovertible." In the short time since Father Seelos was beatified in April 2000, two cases have been submitted to the Redemptorist Postulator General for review.

The Newest "American" Saint!

hrough the intercession of Mother Theodore Guerin, an Indiana man's inexplicable healing of his right eye was deemed a miracle, according to the Vatican committee of medical experts and theologians in 2005. Mother Theodore Guerin is the founder of the Sisters of Providence in Saint Mary-of-the-Woods, Indiana. This final miracle in the nearly century-long process culminated in the canonization of Guerin in October 2006, making her only the eighth saint who has done work primarily in the U.S. and the first saint from Indiana.

Guerin was a French-born nun who went to the Indiana wilderness in 1840 to establish a religious order and Catholic schools on the frontier. One of her early friends and benefactors to the Community was Father Joseph Kundek, the first resident pastor of Jasper. Kundek was an Austrian priest endowed with energy and skill in construction and organization. It was he who established Guerin's Sisters of Providence at Jasper in 1842.

In an interesting bit of connected history, Father Peter Czackert was the first Redemptorist to begin the parish community of Saint Mary's Assumption in New Orleans in 1843. Czackert had acquired a plot of land on Josephine Street

near Constance and the building materials for a church, when he was recalled to Baltimore that same year. It so happened that Father Joseph Kundek from Jasper, Indiana, had left his German congregation for several months to convalesce in New Orleans from an illness. He was commissioned by the bishop of New Orleans to oversee the construction of the

church, with the stipulation that the appointment was temporary and that the church and property would be handed over to the Redemptorists upon their return to the city. Thus, Kundek had the distinction of not only building the first German Catholic church in New Orleans, but also the first in the entire state of Louisiana! In 1847, when Father John Neumann (canonized, 1977) replaced Czackert as Vice-Gerent of the Redemptorists in the U.S., he was responsible for allowing Czackert to return to New Orleans and for permanently establishing the Redemptorists at St. Mary's Assumption Church.



DID YOU KNOW?

In 1852, Father Joseph Kundek brought the Benedictines from Einsiedeln, Switzerland to Indiana. Saint Joseph Abbey in Covington, Louisiana belongs to the Swiss-American Congregation of Benedictines. Saint Joseph's heritage goes through St. Meinrad Archabbey in Indiana, to Einsiedeln, a monastery with a continuous history of more than a thousand years.

Father Joseph Kundek erected churches in several locations. He built the courthouse in Jasper, laid out the town of Ferdinand, IN, and was a friend to St. Theodore Guerin, who said of him, "We indeed owe a great debt to the one who is almost our first benefactor in Indiana." Kundek also constructed the first wood-frame St. Mary's Assumption Church in New Orleans.
