



Special 20th Annual Bl. Francis Seelos Day on April 27 -- 1:00 pm

The 20th Annual "Blessed Francis Seelos Day in New Orleans" will be celebrated on the last Sunday of the month, April 27. A memorial Mass will take place in St. Mary's Assumption Church (at Josephine & Constance streets in the Irish Channel) at 1:00 p.m. (please note new time). Father Gregory Chauvin of Abbeville, LA will be the principal celebrant & homilist. After the Mass there will be an opportunity to venerate a mission crucifix of Fr. Seelos and to view the National Shrine of Francis Seelos, where his mortal remains are permanently housed in a sacred reliquary. Parking for the Mass is also available in an adjacent lot on St. Andrew Street.

Immediately following the Mass, at 2:00 a luncheon will be held at the Hampton Inn Convention Center Grand Ballroom. a cherished landmark in the historic Warehouse District of New Orleans (1201 Convention Center Blvd., between Gaienne & Calliope streets). A Parade of Prizes will support the canonization cause of Fr. Seelos. On-street parking & additional paid parking is available at the hotel & the Fulton Garage across the Square. ST. MARY'S CORNERSTONE OF FAITH: 150™ ANNIVERSARY

On April 25th, 1858, at four o'clock in the afternoon, on the very day that the church of St. Alphonsus was consecrated, the Most. Rev. Archbishop Blanc blessed and laid the cornerstone of St. Mary's Assumption Church. He was assisted by Right Rev. W. H. Elder, Bishop of Natchez; Right Rev. J.M. Odin, Bishop of Galveston; and Right Rev. M. Portier, Bishop of Mobile.... All the societies of the parish attended, with bands playing and banners fluttering in the breeze. The immense throng of people was deeply impressed by the solemn and imposing scene. It was espe-


cially through the untiring efforts of Father Anwander that St. Mary's German Church was built. -- B. J. Krieger, C.Ss.R., Seventy-Five Years of Service (New Orleans: 1923)

In 1844 the first German Catholic church in the state of Louisiana was built, a modest frame structure, which was named St. Mary's Assumption church. It served the congregation for a decade and a half until a much more pretentious church was built on Josephine Street next to the original church. The entire congregation of St. Mary's worked alongside the Redemptorist fathers in building the new church. A plaque today describes how the women parishioners carried bricks in their aprons to the building site. The church was built in modified baroque style with a gilded, domed bell tower that can still be seen throughout the area Still today one can view the beautiful stained-glass windows, great organ, and high altar made in Munich, Germany, one of the finest examples of woodcarving in the country. -- Ellen C. 

On January 13, 2008 the 7th Annual Seelos Healing Mass was celebrated on the Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord. The Gospel proclaimed, "Suddenly the sky opened and he saw the Spirit of God descend like a dove and hover over him" (cf. MT 3:13-17). There was quite a sensation at the Mass when a feathered visitor found its way inside St. Mary's Assumption Church and made itself known at all the right times & places! At "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all," the bird remarkably took its cue at the "Holy Spirit" part and swooped down in the main aisle; during the homily the bird hovered over and then perched on the altar. For the packed church of people in need of healing, many interpreted it as the Lord's comforting sign that His Spirit was present among us, "stirring us up and cheering us on."

SWANSEA, IL

Our grandson, JD, was born in 1996 and diagnosed with Biliary Atresia, which is blockage in the ducts that carry bile from the liver to the gallbladder. This blockage in babies can lead to liver damage that is fatal if untreated. JD's dad gave him a portion of his liver when he was 6 months old, which saved his life at the time, but he developed blood flow blockage between the heart and liver. Requiring a second liver transplant, JD was placed on the donor list and underwent a third major surgery in 2002. To avoid rejection of the liver, JD takes a significant amount of immunosuppressive drugs & steroids that damage the kidneys. We have been praying to Bl. Seelos for over a year asking him to intervene to protect his kidneys from damage. Six months ago, JD was tested to determine the damage. He carried with him a relic of Fr. Seelos. The doctor fully expected his kidney function to be less than 50%. The test results showed them functioning at 85%. We have no doubt that Bl. Seelos did indeed intervene to help JD, and truly believe this to be a miracle.

LOREAUVILLE, LA

We were introduced to Bl. Seelos seven years ago when our grandson was born with severe heart problems. He has had 3 major surgeries and is doing very well. He is truly a miracle child, and we believe it is through Bl. Seelos' intercession to God. We are eternally grateful.

STATEN ISLAND, NY

In 2006 I had surgery to remove half of my thyroid. Cancer was found and further surgery was scheduled to remove the other half. Cancer was on both sides. Afriend, Fr. John Connor, C.Ss.R., who resides at the Long Branch, NJ retreat house had asked me to pray the novena to Bl. Seelos. My husband and I started the novena that evening. I asked many friends to also pray the novena. We all continued to pray that Bl. Seelos would intercede to Jesus for my healing. I later had radiation treatment to destroy the cancerous cells. In September 2007 I had a total body scan and no cancer cells were found. Praise God & thank you, Bl. Seelos!

MOBILE, AL

My symptoms indicated that I had a hiatal hernia with reflux. The procedure to stretch my esophagus discovered that I had a tumor at the base of the esophagus. Part of it extended down into the stomach. The further I got into the tests and chemotherapy. the more I felt like I was dying. I was dreadfully ill, could not eat and lost 70 pounds. They took out part of my esophagus and about 1/3 of my stomach, pulling the balance of my stomach into my chest. My sister gave me a cross that had been touched to the tomb of Fr. Seelos and my pastor had blessed me with a first class relic of Fr. Seelos. The day after my surgery the doctor called my wife & told her that he had done 17 biopsies and that I was cancer free.

KINDER, LA

In May 2007 my grandsons, ages 19 & 21, were critically hurt while in Santiago Chile for a family wedding. Their makeshift sled took off down the mountainside. They both disappeared from sight of their parents and were found inside a 4-foot hole. One hit a cement block at the bottom of the hole and was bleeding from the mouth; his tongue was in shreds and his chin broken. The other had a closed head injury and was not expected to live. Someone sent me a prayer card to Fr. Seelos, and we all prayed for a miracle. That is exactly what we received. Both boys are totally recovered and we attribute it to the healing power of God and

many prayers & intercession of Fr. Seelos. I still pray the prayer daily.

CREST HILL, IL

Years ago, my mother was given a first class relic of Bl. Seelos from a friend. In March 2007 I was diagnosed with breast cancer. I held the relic almost all day and also slept with the relic at night. Family, friends and I prayed for the intercession of St. Joseph and Bl. Seelos. During the last chemo treatment before surgery, I developed an allergic reaction to the drug. I then decided to have a double mastectomy. This turned out to be a blessing, for after surgery, tests were ran and cancer was found in the other breast too small to detect with today's technology. Words cannot express my deep gratitude.

SAN ANTONIO, TX

I watched Catholic TV the other night and saw "Tireless Intercessor." It was good to renew my prayer life to Bl. Seelos with more vigor. The show had me thinking back to 2006 when I had stents put into my lateral artery. The tests showed 70% blockage and yet when the doctor was ready to proceed after testing, the artery showed only 40% blockage. No stents were required. I had requested prayers and a Mass at the Seelos Shrine. Makes me wonder!


