Proclamation

- WHEREAS,** Father Francis Xavier Seelos, a 19th century Redemptorist, left his Bavarian home to become a missionary in the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS,** Father Seelos came to New Orleans, Louisiana; and
- WHEREAS,** Father Seelos worked tirelessly to comfort those afflicted by the New Orleans yellow fever epidemic of 1867, until he himself was struck down by the disease and died on October 4, 1867; and
- WHEREAS,** his sacred remains rest in the national shrine at St. Mary's Assumption Church; and
- WHEREAS,** His Holiness Pope John Paul II beatified Father Seelos in Rome in the solemn Jubilee Year 2000; and
- WHEREAS,** Sydney Barthelemy, the Honorable Mayor of the City of New Orleans proclaimed May 15, 1988, as "Father Seelos Day in New Orleans."
- NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Bobby Jindal, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do hereby proclaim October 5, 2008 as

FATHER SEELOS DAY
in the State of Louisiana.

GOVERNOR PROCLAIMS 'FATHER SEELOS DAY IN LOUISIANA'

The Governor of Louisiana issued a proclamation to commemorate the 141st anniversary of Blessed Francis Seelos' death in New Orleans: "I, Bobby Jindal, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do hereby proclaim October 5, 2008 as Father Seelos Day in the State of Louisiana."

The proclamation, with the Governor's actual signature, attests that "Father Seelos worked tirelessly to comfort those afflicted by the New Orleans yellow fever epidemic of 1867, until he himself was struck down by the disease and died on October 4, 1867." It further notes that the sacred remains of this revered Redemptorist missionary "rest in the national shrine at St. Mary's Assumption Church."

Representatives from the Governor's Office indicated the present administration's infrequent declarations of executive proclamations for a state-wide honorary day, and added how the two to date were coincidentally issued the same week -- one for a former sheriff; the other, for a future saint. On October 1, 2008, Louisiana's First Lady Supriya Jindal read a proclamation from the governor before a large crowd at a memorial service and statue dedication in Metairie, LA declaring "Sheriff Harry Lee Day in honor of his service to the people of the State of Louisiana," on the one-year anniversary of his death.

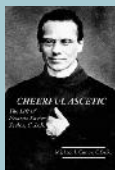
How can You Participate?

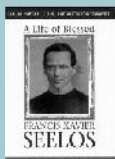

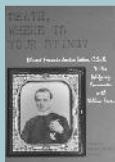

A Saint Among Us: Carol's Story

It's a pretty safe bet that Fr. Seelos had to roll up his sleeves when Carol came calling. Las Vegas would have booked her as a "long shot." Carol caught a lucky break in 1999 with an early detection of breast cancer. After extensive chemo, she seemed okay. Two years later a jubilant friend gave Carol a simple hug and broke two of her ribs. That's not normal and the suspicion was her cancer had returned and spread to her bones. A mammogram revealed an ominous spot in the location of the original cancer. She was told the probability of a malignancy was very high. She tried to prepare herself. She prayed [to Seelos] as she waited for the biopsy results. Much to her doctors' amazement and Carol's relief, no sign of cancer was found. End of Act I.

Two years went by before Act II opened. This would be the main act, as if the first wasn't bad enough. She was diagnosed with sarcoidosis, a devastating and potentially fatal disease that drastically impairs the immune system and can appear in almost any organ in the body. The cause is unknown and the cure is nonexistent. Carol's liver was rapidly deteriorating and taking her kidney with it. [She was] placed on a double transplant list. She waited and she prayed.

... She went into renal failure and was, as she puts it, "walking dead," when she received her second Seelos blessing. She has little memory of that event and Roger, her husband, raced her directly to the hospital where she lapsed into a coma. Family members were summoned and frantically prayed for her life and she was anointed. After a week on death's doorstep she awoke. Incredibly, less than a week later she received a double-organ transplant and went home.

She describes herself today as a "perfectly healthy person," and is quick to point out that without the intercession of Fr. Seelos she'd be dead. "Every conscious moment during this entire ordeal I had a Seelos relic in my hand" she said. But it was one of those unconscious moments that is forever etched in Carol's memory. In the center of a beautiful vision stood her beloved mother. Just behind her mother stood a bespectacled, handsome young man with a "saintly" smile. Francis Xavier Seelos. Critics would say that "vision" was all in Carol's mind. Of course it was, because first it was in her heart and then filled her soul. That is where all healing begins.

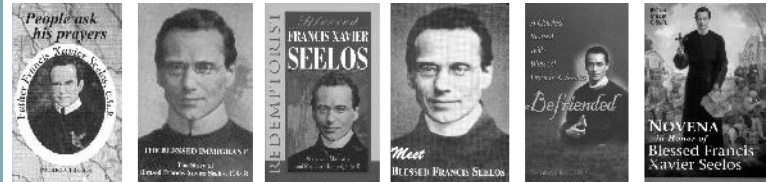
