




The Sanctuary as Seelos Saw It

In the 1800s, many Irish immigrants in New Orleans found work primarily on the River wharves; German immigrants engaged in work as artisans, tailors, bakers and meatpackers, as well as in the euphemistic "coffee-houses" that functioned more as a saloon and less like a modern-day Starbucks; the French Gascons earned their livelihood principally in the restaurant business. But, whatever the occupation, they all could find a home in the Redemptorist complex, with its three impressive churches for each nationality.

Notre Dame de Bon Secours, the smallest of the three, accommodated 350 people. It was described as a quaint structure with vaulted ceilings, tasteful stained glass & religious statuary. Construction began in 1857 on Jackson Avenue, between Constance & Laurel streets. This church served a loyal French congregation for almost 70 years before a decision was made by the Archbishop in the early 1920s to amalgamate the three Redemptorist parishes into one. Notre Dame Church was later taken down after irreparable hurricane damage.



Father Seelos' ability to speak English, German & French was especially useful in New Orleans, where the Redemptorists actually had tri-lingual ministry. It appears that Father Seelos performed the wedding of Peter Carstens & Mary Piquery at Notre Dame Church on October 18, 1866 -- less than a month after his arrival in the Crescent City.



Stereo cards were especially popular from the 1840s through the 1930s. Two nearly identical pictures were mounted on stiff cardbacking to create a three-dimensional image when viewed through a stereoscope. Samuel T. Blessing was among early stereoview photographers.

FR. SEELOS: MODEL FOR YEAR OF THE PRIEST

"The most important thing a father can do for his children is to love their mother," wrote Theodore Hesburgh. So, in that sense, my vocation was nurtured at home by my parents. While in high school I worked at my great uncle's shoe store. I wondered at the time if God was calling me to a future in soles; a few years later, I questioned if God was instead calling me to a future in souls. I'm hoping my vocation isn't based on a supreme misinterpretation! Of the two, I'd say priesthood has been the better fit.

The Redemptorist grade school and parish in my Louisiana hometown acquainted me at a young age with Perpetual Help devotions, St. Alphonsus' Stations of the Cross, and the Cause of a certain Father Francis Xavier Seelos. Moreover, the approachable nature of Redemptorists helped make the CSSR way of life an attractive course to follow.

When first joining the Congregation, I thought that by depriving myself of some things, I could better avail myself of those things that matter most. Truthfully speaking, any deprivations in vowed life over the years have been overly compensated: the connections made in ministry have been more than rewarding, and my connection to genuine friends and classmates in the Congregation are reminders that I am seldom alone in being alone.

It is said that in Pittsburgh, Father Seelos encountered a poor man in the bitter cold whose toes were exposed through his torn shoes. Father Seelos kindly asked the man for his shoes and gave in return the boots from his own feet, to arrive later at home wearing the tattered shoes himself. Father Seelos developed a love for others by walking in their shoes - literally and figuratively!

With such an exemplary "sole provider" in the Redemptorist Congregation as this, I'm glad I didn't set up shop elsewhere!

DID YOU KNOW?

Before President Obama met Pope Benedict XVI last month, the state department sought the perfect gift for the president to present to the pope: a priestly stole belonging to the Redemptorists that had been draped atop the sacred remains of Saint John Neumann at his shrine in Philadelphia. Neumann, canonized in 1977, was the first Redemptorist to profess vows in America. He established the Catholic parochial school system in the U.S. Bl. Francis Seelos & St. John Neumann were stationed together in Pittsburgh for several years. "We're giving the gift because it was asked for by our government to be given to the pope, and it's an honor," said Fr. Al Bradley, C.Ss.R.







doctors expected the baby to be born within that time. I immediately started praying to Fr. Seelos to ask Jesus to help this little baby. I sent the Seelos first-class relic to my son and everyone was amazed that the baby wasn't born in the first 48 hours. Instead, a baby son was born 32 weeks and one day along! Doctors & nurses were calling this baby a miracle child. I will always look to Fr. Seelos, who I know is very dear to Jesus, for helping get us through this.

ANNAPOLIS, MD

After I read an article in the Catholic newspaper, I went to St. Mary's Church in Annapolis, where I go several times a week, but never had gone to the statue of Bl. Seelos sitting on a bench in the church garden. I prayed and asked him to heal my squamous cell cancer. Since then, it has been getting smaller and has almost disappeared.

LAFAYETTE, LA

When pregnant for my daughter I was told that I had an inoperable, untreatable brain tumor -- probable cancer -- & that I had about 18 months to live. I would not allow a biopsy when informed that I would lose speech & language abilities. Eight years later, I was told that the tumor was "probably a capillary telangectasia" (a mass of blood vessels). My brain scans traveled the U.S. & the tumor was thought by all to be a glioma. A friend brought me a Bl. Seelos relic & we went to the shrine while I was pregnant. It is not "clear cut" how I received my miracle, but I gained strength from Bl. Seelos during my time of suffering.
