


Dear Friends of Fr. Seelos,


IN CELEBRATION OF FATHERS

Seelos: My European Years, Part 3 - Setting out on my own

Being 13 years old is a tough time for a young man. And so it was for me. All the kids were giving serious attention to what our future life would look like and the steps we had to take to get where we wanted to go. We were excited about growing into adulthood but we weren't there yet. Setting forth into something so new at the end of my grade school years that would entail cutting the apron strings was hard. Still, we had to move on to the next part of our lives and so I left for St. Stephen's in Augsburg. There were several boys from Füssen going to the same school, including two of my cousins.

The city of Augsburg was more than a bit overwhelming to me. It was 15 times larger than my home town, 90 miles north of Füssen. Only half the population was Catholic. The city was known as the place where the Lutheran Augsburg Confession

was formulated, the first organized profession of the Protestant faith. The entire environment seemed so different and, in reality, frightened me more than a bit. I was heartsick to leave the warmth of my family home and town for a student rooming house.

The *Stephansplatz*, where St. Stephen's formed three sides of the quadrangle, had only existed for four years as an independent school before I entered, but it already had 600 students registered. The school offered an eight-year course of study but I entered during the second year of the Latin School, so this became my home for seven years. We studied Latin, Greek, German, religion, history and geography and were expected to attend daily Mass and on Sunday, vespers in the afternoon. My first semester consisted of 22 hours of class – 12 of Latin, 4 of

German, and 2 hours each of geography, arithmetic and religion every week. I also took a class in French. In spite of being very busy, I did well in my grades. All my years of study continued the intense curriculum but I was able to manage.

Music still stirred my soul. I got better on the violin and enthusiastically played the instrument at Mass until one Sunday, when I continued playing after the song was complete, I was told I was no longer needed as an accompanist. I loved to sing also, so much so that my friend had

to ask me not to sing so loudly at church.

Each year after the intensity of my studies, I delighted in returning home for vacation. This was a time for hiking through the beautiful valleys and mountains. I hiked into the *Tyrol* and on one occasion all the way to Switzerland. Sometimes my father hiked with me. On one occasion, we walked 150 miles to Einsiedeln Abbey in Switzerland! Whether in study or on vacation, my heart was always filled with joy. What a blessing! Others seemed to sense this and enjoyed my company, which further delighted me.


During my years at St. Stephen's, I thought more and more about becoming a priest. I envisioned becoming a cleric in my home diocese, with my sisters living in the household as cook and housekeeper (a practice common in those days).

On August 26, 1839, I won the approval of the examiners of St. Stephen's which qualified me for education at university. I was 22 years old at the time. University was expensive and my family had no extra cash. I would have to win a scholarship. A petition for this was drawn up and signed by the mayor of Füssen and other officials and sent to the provincial council. By the grace of God, the petition was approved, paving the way for me to move on to higher education. I was on my way to the Royal Ludwig Maximilian University in Munich.
















Blessings for the Sick
