

Dear Seelos Devotees,

You'll hear often this month that there are only so many days left to shop for Christmas. Gift giving is a long standing tradition as a means of expressing our love. In the Church, we also prepare for Christmas during Advent. In our attempts to fill in our valleys and take down our hills so God has a straight path into our hearts, we prepare for the gift of Christ the Lord. In February of 1860, Father Seelos wrote a letter to his sister about visiting his former parish, St. Alphonsus, at Christmastime:

I arrived there on Christmas Eve and Father Ruland, the present rector, after a most kind welcome, asked me to celebrate Mass at five o'clock at the orphanage. Then I was to sing High Mass at Saint Alphonsus Church... At five-thirty, all the children were present. They really sang out with one accord as if all the shepherds of Palestine had gathered to bring to the Christ Child their innocent hearts and carols. But the most striking thing happened at ten o'clock in St. Alphonsus Church, ... when I cam out of the sacristy to give the Asperges, the school children recognized me first. You should really have seen those little ones; what joy suddenly lighted up all their faces. ... The grown ups, too, quickly nodded to each other and didn't know what to do to express their great joy. ... After Mass, there was nothing else I could do but to say at least a few words to the many who came without interruption and brought me gifts of all kinds. This happened with such a warmth and depth of feeling that both men and women could not talk except with tears in their eyes.

I'm sure that those who have devotion to Blessed Seelos understand the joyful celebration he felt at his return to St. Alphonsus; but even more, we know why there was such affection for him. In his daily life, he filled in the valleys and lowered the hills, welcoming always the presence of God in his soul. He was a beloved priest and the people honored that. We, too, honor Blessed Seelos in our own day as we pray in our Seelos prayer: "You lived here among our ancestors. You taught them, blessed them and prayed for them. Now we come to you!" And we know he will pray with us this Christmas for our many needs.

What will you bring him?


The most acceptable present you can bring him is that of a contrite and loving heart.





Seelos: Part 9 - Shouldering a heavy load in Baltimore

This book, written by Fr. Richard Boever, C.Ss.R., is the story of Blessed Seelos' life told as though he were telling his own story. Look for additional installments in future issues of this newsletter.



I learned a lot during my years as a parish priest at St. Philomena's in Pittsburgh, but in 1854, I received a new assignment. Fr. George Ruland was named provincial of the American Province in January and I was transferred from Pittsburg to St. Alphonsus Parish in Baltimore to succeed him as pastor and superior. I arrived there on March 2.

The Redemptorist community of St. Alphonsus also served the parishes of St. James and St. Michael in the city as well

as several German speaking immigrant communities across a much larger area. It was a big job. The congregations were large and all the fathers and brothers were kept busy with the sacraments, spiritual conferences, individual spiritual direction to the parishioners and religious in the neighborhood, as well as the details of administrating and maintaining the parishes. There were seven parish priests besides me and eight brothers stationed at St. Alphonsus.

Later that year, the Redemptorists superiors were called to Rome to consider legislation for the men worldwide. For our Chapter, we elected a delegate from the province to make the trip. Secretly, I really wanted to be elected, not so much for the honor this would bestow upon me but because a trip to Rome would enable me to visit my family back in Bavaria while I was in Europe. Unfortunately, I was not chosen.

For some reason or another, people often ask me about several wonderful healings that took place when I prayed with these sick or injured people. I was always thankful to the power of God in these instances and I really don't want to talk about them for fear of taking the credit for the healings. Any wonder involved in these events belongs solely to the compassion of God. In fact, I was very much aware of my own weaknesses. I was also reminded of my inadequacy when a burden fell upon my head. I was, at the time, the highest authority among the Redemptorists in America when one of our men became

mentally unstable. We had to place him in a facility run by the Sisters of Charity for the mentally deranged. When I visited this man later, I thought he seemed recovered and, against the recommendation of the hospital staff, I brought him back to community. It didn't work out well and he had to be readmitted into the hospital. The confreres didn't much appreciate my compassion and even wrote to Rome about the incident, condemning me.

Beyond my spiritual struggles, my body showed me just how vulnerable I was. In March 1857, I fell sick. After hearing confessions for many hours, when I left the confessional and stretched to restore my circulation, blood started coming from my mouth. One of the confreres saw this and reported the incident to the provincial. From Saturday afternoon until Sunday afternoon, the blood continued issuing from a hemorrhage in my throat. I did go back to the confessional after supper on Saturday evening and Sunday morning but was eventually I transferred to the smaller St. Mary's Parish in Annapolis, Maryland, for health reasons. But my time in Annapolis would be short-lived; after only a month I was sent to Cumberland, Maryland. I was appointed prefect of our professed students in Cumberland. The former director of students was considered too rigid, melancholic, and ignorant of the American character. I was seen as the person who could bring stability to the house of formation. So I moved on to Maryland.
