Seelos: Part 6 - My first years in America

This book, written by Fr. Richard Boever, C.Ss.R., is the story of Blessed Seelos' life told as though he were telling his own story. Look for additional installments in future issues of this newsletter.

I headed to America on St. Patrick's Day, March 17, 1843, to join the Redemptorist community and serve the German speaking Catholics in the United States. Three priests and three Brothers had come to the United States from the Order eleven years earlier, but a permanent settlement could not be found in the Midwest that could support a community of priests and religious brothers - they were all too small. Originally, the missionaries envisioned work among the Native peoples but eventually discovered that, as one man wrote, "for every Indian who was converted, ten Germans lost the faith." The need to serve immigrants was immense and since they came from Germany, the priests and Brothers were equipped to serve them.

After seven years going from place to place, the community accepted work among the German immigrants in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. By the time I arrived in America, the number of confreres had increased to ten priests and five Brothers with houses in five cities. 14 new members arrived with me in 1843 – six priests, five Brothers, one professed clerical student and two novices, including myself.

We anchored in New York harbor after a long journey across the Atlantic and then traveled to the parish of St. James in Baltimore. I began my novitiate on May 16, preparing for my profession of vows. After novitiate, I continued my theological studies there until my ordination to the priesthood on December 22, 1844. I didn't begin preaching, however, until April 1845 – one of the Fathers criticized my delivery rather harshly!

During my time in Baltimore, I was told to study English. I was not pleased to study the new language, but I obeyed. Eventually, I was able to "get by" in English, but it took a long time before I found any comfort in speaking it. We also were instructed to wear secular clothing on the street because of a terrible anti-Catholic prejudice found among some American people. Many long-time residents considered themselves "true Americans" because their families had been here longer than the newly-arrived immigrants, many of whom were Catholic.

I didn't like the bedbugs, the insects, all the different religious sects, the preoccupation of the nation with money, and the lack of religious symbols on the streets, but I expected this would be the case from the reports I had heard. I wrote to my family that if I had acted according to my own feelings, I would never have set foot in America. However, it is God who disposes, and I knew every day that being here was God's will for me. I was healthy and wanted for nothing. We had heat in the winter and water in the house and I felt accepted and supported in the community. This was important to me because in these early days of ministry, I felt very backward and seemed to make a thousand mistakes every day. I certainly did have an adjustment period in the new life I was experiencing in America.

From the desk of Fr. Enderle: extending the mission of Blessed Seelos

Fulfilling, rewarding, precious... and I love it. Such is my ministry here at the Seelos Shrine and beyond.

I serve as Vice-postulator of the Blessed Francis Seelos Cause for Sainthood, so I am often surrounded by people of rich faith. They turn to our God for healing for themselves and for others, and in prayer they ask, as we say, "through the intercession" of Blessed Seelos.

Recently a grandmother called me. Her grandson, only eight years old, had been diagnosed with severe brain cancer. With due caution for coronavirus, we arranged that I would meet to pray with her, her grandson, and the young boy's parents on the family's front porch, shaded by the ancient oaks of New Orleans.

The prayer and blessing took place as planned. I brought with me Fr. Seelos' Redemptorist Mission Cross which was so much a part of his missionary travels more than a century ago. This cross is our revered treasure. Who could ever count the thousands whom he blessed with that very cross! And in the last year of his life he blessed people with this very cross who suffered from yellow fever, succumbing to it himself in 1867.

So here I was, so to speak, retracing his footsteps. What a moment it was for the parents and grandmother of this boy, and for me, when the youngster asked me, "Can I hold the cross of Father Seelos?"

Tears followed. For in that moment grandparent, parents and I shared an extension of the mission of Blessed Seelos on a porch in New Orleans, under the aged oak trees which may well have seen Father Seelos in person back in 1867.
