Seelos: Part 10 – Life experience is a great teacher!

This book, written by Fr. Richard Boever, C.Ss.R., is the story of Blessed Seelos' life told as though he were telling his own story. Look for additional installments in future issues of this newsletter.



In 1857 I was transferred to Cumberland, Maryland to take the place of the Director of our professed students. It was felt that a change was badly needed; I packed my bags and headed into a new assignment 140 miles west of Baltimore.

The city of Cumberland was nestled in the Allegheny mountains and known as the gateway to the West. There were six thousand inhabitants and the city served as a transportation hub for the B&O Railroad and for barge traffic on the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal. It was predominately a Protestant town where the Redemptorists in 1849 had established a permanent community after serving the German Catholic immigrants in the area

for some time out of Baltimore. When I arrived in Cumberland, the Redemptorist community had three priests, eight brothers and forty-two students preparing for ordination.

My life grew into a regular routine of formation and parish ministry. One of the things that was unpleasant during my Cumberland years was the startling news I heard, by way of rumor, that the Bishop of Pittsburgh, Michael O'Connor, had submitted his resignation to Rome for health reasons and had recommended *me* as the first name on his list of those he thought should succeed him as bishop. I panicked. I wrote to everyone I could begging them to pray that this not become a reality. I even wrote to the Holy Father telling him I would not be a good choice.

Luckily, the Pope had sent a Cardinal to speak with our Superior General in Rome about my qualifications. The Superior General reported that I would not be a

> good choice because I was not a good manager of temporal affairs and that the American and Irish clergy would not like to have a German named bishop in Pittsburgh. When I found out that another had been chosen, I was greatly relieved and threw a party with the students that lasted a whole day to celebrate the fact.

> The students and I got along quite well. They were very open to formation and diligently

applied themselves to the task. We also knew how to enjoy excursions into the countryside together. I found that such informal times were very productive for their formation and I myself enjoyed these trips. There were, indeed, formal lectures about religious life. I also still taught some of the theology classes and occasionally I had to give a correction or two, but formation, in my opinion, went beyond this. Life experience is a great teacher!

The city of Cumberland was located very near to Virginia, a state that made up part of the Confederate States during the Civil War. In the furor of war, nerves were often fraved. One time, our students were playing some sport or another on the hillside. A young man of the town saw the students and mistook them for confederate soldiers. He ran to town shouting that enemy troops were seen at Saints Peter and Paul. At gunpoint, the students were rounded up. Luckily, after allowing the locals to go through the house to guarantee that we were not enemy agents storing weapons of war, all ended peacefully.

After I lived five years in Cumberland, the student formation program for professed members of the Congregation was moved to Annapolis, Maryland. As formation director, I went along with the students. I wrote to my sister back home that Annapolis was too nice for me and that the move was easy for me.

Excerpt from a letter written by Blessed Seelos to his sister, Antonia, from Cumberland, 1862:

Dear Sister, I must tell you about a few strange things in America. We not only have a sewing machine and a washing machine, but also a machine with which the brothers peel potatoes. I almost always have to laugh when I see it; it goes so fast. In the rooms we usually use tallow candles, but in the refectory, in the corridors, and in the church we use gas for lighting. The windows are made in such a way that they stay put when they are opened and you can close them again without difficulty. The lamps are made in such a way that you don't have to push up the candle as it burns, which often is quite difficult, but you press and push the lamp together and more of the candle comes up. On the trains, there is water in the cars, where everyone can get a drink, and in summer it is even cooled with ice. And there are toilets in the cars, all enclosed.
