His kindness and patience made him a beloved figure in the communities he served.



Redemptorists have been called by the church to bring the good news to the people who are on the margins of society and those who want to grow in faith. The Redemptorist Family is much more than the priests, brothers and deacons who have professed vows in the congregation. The support of this family to help us in the mission is vast since there are many people that make the mission possible. We would not be able to accomplish the work of Jesus the Redeemer without the help of the laity and others in this task.

The Redemptoristine Nuns, religious institutes that share the charism, members of the confraternity of Our Mother of Perpetual Help, Co-Redemptorists, Oblates, volunteers at our shrines, parishes and retreat houses, benefactors, family members, friends that support Redemptorists, and staff are indispensable for the mission and are recognized as members of this family.

Father Rogerio concluded with an encouraging and visionary summary: "Lay people connected to our Congregation become multipliers of the spirituality and charism in their own families, workplaces and communities, helping to spread the charism and deepen our charism, identity and mission as a Redemptorist Family."

On February 2, 2022 I went to the hospital, swollen and discolored. I was in complete liver failure and all my organs were shutting down. My doctors told my mom and my grandfather to make funeral arrangements because I was not going to survive past the week. My twin sister died 10 years ago of the same thing. It was a genetic flaw in our liver.

My grandfather refused to believe that this was the end of my life. His favorite person was Father Seelos. He went to church at least once a week for all his life and had medals and cards and constantly prayed to him. When I was in the hospital, he went to church and prayed to Father Seelos to help save me. He bought me blessed stuff from the Shrine, and we all prayed and prayed every day.

I stayed in the hospital for three months. After I was discharged, I had to learn how to walk again because I had not moved the whole time I was in the hospital. That was a painful process but I pushed and pushed. I was swollen and gained 40 pounds because of fluid. I was miserable and depressed and did not know how I was going to go on. I prayed every day to Father Seelos to give me strength.

During this time, I also developed

cancer in my liver. I had to go through seemingly constant tests, MRIs, CAT scans, you name it. In March 2023, I had radiation treatment while I waited for a transplant. The radiation killed the cancer, but it also damaged my liver. The transplant didn't come through until June 2023. By that time I could barely move. I was weak and in so much pain that I didn't know if I was going to survive, but the call finally came and I had a full liver transplant.

Well, I had 2% chance of living and I beat the odds. It's like I have a whole new life now. My doctors said that if I wouldn't have had the transplant surgery when I did, I would've died in my sleep in a couple of weeks because my liver was so damaged. I truly believe I was not supposed to live, but I did.

I fought hard to survive this death sentence. It was a long and painful battle, but I did it with all the prayers, hope and love from my friends, family, God, and especially Father Seelos. I truly believe he interceded for me. He gave me the strength and courage to keep on pushing and fighting no matter how bad I wanted to give up. I am so blessed to be alive and healthy at 44 years old, and I want the world to know!

When I was diagnosed with Melanoma, a friend gave me a Blessed Seelos candle and prayer card. I lit the candle and prayed everyday for a successful surgery.

My cancer is now gone and the PET scan did not show any other spots. Thank you God and Blessed Seelos!

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
BLESSED SEELOS PRAYER


